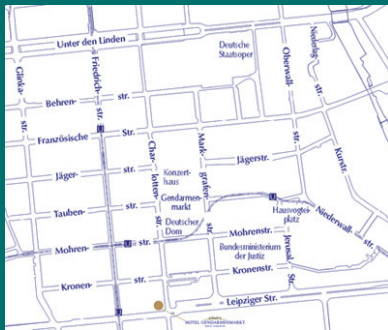

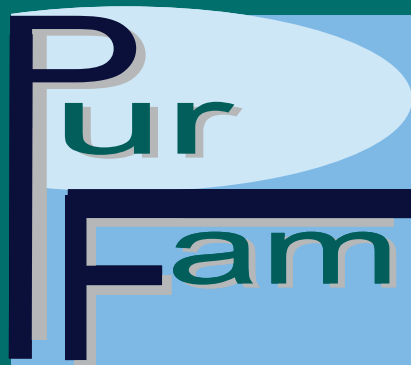
## International Workshop

The purpose of PURFAM is to improve clinical practice in the prevention of elder abuse by facilitating the early recognition of mistreatment and neglect in individual caregiving settings and by strengthening caregivers' resources.

Existing policies in the field of child welfare can provide important impulses in formalizing operations in the field and in defining the competence of specific public authorities.

Experience gained through regional and subject-specific networking could also be beneficial.

In the following workshop, research scientists and practitioners will be presented with a training-program that enables professionals working with care-recipients and their families to identify abusive behaviour and to strengthen caregivers' resources while considering risk- and protective factors of the individual setting. Workshop participants will be asked to discuss the proposed program respective to their expertise in international best-practice approaches and aspects of feasibility within the national context of the Federal Republic of Germany [FRG].
