

- Association of lecturers and professors coming from different faculties of the university of cologne
- Interdisciplinary and broad approach
- In the center of social life diversity as potential of postmodern society can be a motor for development in various fields (politics, education, economics, art, music, etc.)
- Central idea: increasing relevance of the phenomenon „diversity“ in social and cultural contexts
- The work of *cedis* is based on:
  - a) the active support of postgraduates working on their dissertations at the University of Cologne
  - b) the tutoring of students which is achieved for example by means of the annual *Summerschool* project.


- **Cooperation with the American Dewey-Center at the Southern Illinois University in Carbondale**
